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TOWN OF NAPLES BOARD MEETING

October 12, 2020

CALL TO ORDER:

Meeting was called to order at 6:06 p.m. by Town Chairman Dennis Olson presiding over the meeting at Naples Town Hall, S283 County Road BB, Mondovi, WI 54755.

ROLL CALL:

Board members present: Town Chairman, Dennis Olson, First Supervisor, Paul Accola, Second Supervisor, Brett Cole, Town Treasurer, Andy Goss, and Town Clerk, Jackie Dregney. Resident present was Neil Segerstrom; also present was Doug Tollefson of Doug's Trucking and Excavating.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

No Public Comments.

APPROVE MINUTES:

Motion by Cole and seconded by Accola to approve the minutes from September 14, 2020. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Tollefson updated the Board on road construction. Nichols Road has new culvert and top soil; ready for blacktop, Gonty has been saw cut and is pave ready, Pace/Gonty turned out nice. Youth is within 5-6 loads of crushed rock; Buffalo County milled/packed last week. Culvert on Youth is showing surface rust on the bottom, Tollefson purchased a resurface material that will be applied to try and seal and prolong the life of the culvert. Trempealeau County is supposed to start this week; however, they need to finish their work that is time sensitive for completion on and then they will head this way.

PURCHASE NEW PLOW:

After discussion of current 8' plow, motion by Cole and seconded by Accola to purchase a new Western Pro Plus heavy duty 10' plow from Northwest Enterprises for \$6,646 plus the cost of customized 12" oversized shoe pads. Motion carried. Olson will take the 8' plow to Hansen & Young Auction to sell.

HIGH-SPEED INTERNET:

Olson would like to have a survey sent out to residents to see if there is interest in pursuing high-speed internet through a new provider. Goss said survey could be included with the tax statements. When feedback is received, he will look at the next step in providing faster, more reliable internet service to residents. A committee will be formed when needed. No action.

RAIN GUTTER INSTALLATION AT TOWN SHOP:

Motion by Accola and seconded by Cole to approve installation of rain gutters at the Town Shop by Frank Brantner for \$2,750. Water is leaking into the building causing issues. Motion carried.

BASEMENT WALL AT TOWN HALL:

Olson has reached out to Western Dairyland regarding the basement wall being pushed in 4 inches when the blacktop project was done on the playground area. Cedar Corporation has been out to look at it. Troy Peterson, an engineer from Cedar Corp. stated the building is safe to use, however the issue is causing leakage in the basement. Olson would like to have it saw cut out and replaced. No action.

USED CULVERTS AT TOWN HALL:

Olson will offer for sale the used culverts that are stored at the Town Hall for \$8 per foot. If they don't sell, he will take to Hansen & Young auction. He will also check with the county to see about purchasing culvert markers to help protect them from being hit by the plow. No action.

DISCUSS/ACTION ON INSTALLING ANOTHER DOORWAY FOR ELECTIONS TO ALLOW SOCIAL DISTANCING FOR ELECTORS:

Gonstad Quality Construction has begun work on the doorway installation for the polling room for keeping people social distanced from one another and allowing traffic flow in one direction. No action.

REVIEW PROPOSED 2021 BUDGET:

Board was presented with and reviewed the proposed 2021 budget. No action.

DISCUSS OTHER BUSINESS:

All bills were presented and paid.
