TOWN OF NAPLES BOARD MEETING July 10, 2023

CALL TO ORDER:

The Town of Naples Monthly Board Meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Town Chairman, Ross Kruger presiding over the meeting at Naples Town Hall, S283 County Road BB, Mondovi, WI 54755

ROLL CALL

Board members present: Town Chairman, Ross Kruger, First Supervisor, Neil Segerstrom, Second Supervisor, Scott Smith, Town Treasurer, Pamela Hansen, and Town Clerk, Jackie Dregney.

CITIZEN'S COMMENTS

Residents presented concerns of brush that has not been mowed in ditches for a period of time. Kruger advised Town will continue to mow as in the past due to costs.

APPROVE MINUTES FROM JUNE 12 MEETING AND MAY 15 SPECIAL MEETING

Motion by Segerstrom and seconded by Smith to approve the June 12 minutes. Motion carried.

Motion by Smith and seconded by Segerstrom to approve the May 15 minutes. Motion carried.

CHAIR REPORT

Kruger reported that he signed the Norden Road bridge to culvert petition for 2024 that was started in 2022 and approved for 2023. Road grants applied for were denied. Mentioned Gov. Evers vetoing rural road assistance bill. Shared a three-year road plan with proposed roads that need attention. He will get prices on Gonty, Youth, Nicoles, and Hovey Valley for crack filling, and an opinion on Hovey Valley in whether crack filling is the best option seeing it was paved in 2015. Timmer Reglin will work on gravel roads per estimate. Will wait until fall on Tanner and Bennie Road as there is corn in the right of way. Timmer will charge \$100 per hour \$115 an hour with grader. Gravel will cost \$290 per load. Motion by Segerstrom and seconded by Smith to allow Kruger to give Timmer Reglin permission to work on Pace and Cole Roads. Motion carried.

DAVID PLAGENZ

Kruger reached out to David Plagenz who works for Monarch and is not for hire for writing grants. Gave a contact for chip sealing and crack filling as he only does paving.

OAKRIDGE ENGINEERING

Kruger talked to Leitz about working on a plan for paving Segerstrom and Cole Roads, and chip sealing Golf and Whitworth. Leitz will continue to help with grant writing.

PROPANE CONTRACT

Motion by Segerstrom and seconded by Smith to approve the LP contract with Alcivia for 2,000 gallons at \$1.599 per gallon. Motion carried. Kruger will follow up with Thaler and check on diesel fuel prices.

TOWN SHOP CLEANUP

Gentleman in Eleva will take metal and culvert material at no cost to the town. The township will hire Dylan Kruger to cut the brush and grass at the town shop.

TOWN HALL SIDING

Kruger reached out to Gonstead Construction for siding the town hall and he has not heard back at the time of meeting. Melvin Yoder submitted a bid for \$17,500 for installing vinyl siding. Will bring back to future meeting after additional bids are received. Vinyl siding was suggested instead of steel due to the nature of what the building is used for. Tabled until the next meeting.

COLE ROAD SPECIAL MEETING

Verbal offer from Brett and Cathy Cole to pay for the materials to pave Cole Road in exchange for it becoming a dead end just past their property. Kruger is opposed of closing the road as it is not in the best interest of the residents in the township. After further discussion it was decided to bring it to the next meeting. No action.

OPERATOR'S LICENSE APPROVAL

1. Victoria Johnson – Together Farms

Motion by Segerstrom and seconded by Smith to approve the license application. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Hansen shared the savings account was opened at CCF, LANDNAV for municipal tax collections is now live. New Attorney General Opinion using state DOT funds for bridges are usually 80/20 which can not be used in petitions if state dollars are being used.

PAYMENT OF BILLS PRESENTED

Bills were presented and paid.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Kruger shared that Timmer Reglin will also do brush cutting for \$115 an hour with equipment that can reach 24 feet.
